



1914: HBC's current building was built as the Valecia Condensed Milk Company. They filed bankruptcy while under construction, so in 1915, a newly organized Hillsboro Condensed Milk Company took ownership of the building.

2012: Hillsboro Brewing Company was re-established at our uptown location. Original HBC existed from late 1800's-1943 (excluding prohibition)



Nov 2017: Snapper and Kim purchased and started renovation on a very decrepit building. Renovations lasted a year and a half.



August 7th, 2019: Hillsboro Brewing Company opened its doors to the new restaurant.

1966-1973: United Mink Producers Association owned the building and processed mink pelts.

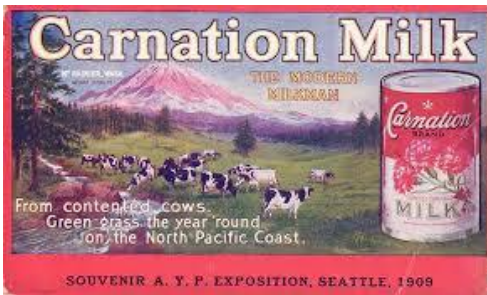
1973: Neighboring Kickapoo Oil Company purchased the building as additional storage space and maintenance facility for their fuel transport trucks.

1929: Hillsboro Condensed Milk company sold to John F. Jelke Company.
1935: John F. Jelke Company sold to Carnation Milk Products Company who owned it until 1956.

2015: HBC purchased the now Whitaker's market building up town to begin brewing our beer locally. It was previously brewed at the Corner Pub in Reedsburg.

March 2018: Brewery Operations were moved from what is now Whitaker's Market to its current location at the new facility.
